

Laura Wagley has been West High's girls' soccer coach for four years. She joined the Blackhawks after one year at Sterling High School.

Ms. Wagley is a 2008 graduate of Aurora University where she competed in soccer all four years. At her native Sycamore, she was a two star athlete, excelling in basketball and soccer.

Laura teaches PE and health at West, directly applying her major. The health curriculum includes nutrition, relationships and emotions.

Laura has been playing soccer since first grade. She now coaches that sport and oversees three levels: freshman, jayvee and varsity. About 60 girls are in the program each year. The season starts at the end of February and concludes in mid-May. Off-season, weights, laps, and Sunday open gym are available to the girls. Playing and practicing on the outdoor turf is a treat. She encourages her players to join traveling teams in the summer.

Her pastimes include socializing with friends, home cooking and running marathons. She has run the Chicago marathon three times. Evenings are also occupied with earning her masters degree in Educational Leadership at Olivet Nazarene. Laura also finds time to coach the freshman girls' volleyball team.

Laura is a dedicated athlete, coach and professional. West is fortunate to have her in the classroom and on the sidelines.

Perhaps Tolis was predestined to oversee a round-ball sport, as his ancestor from ancient Greece, Sisyphus, spent many an hour rolling a rock to the top of the hill. Well, no sissies need apply to Tolis' teams, as coach will be doing what it takes to propel his squad to the top of the conference.

Tolis, a native of Wheaton, graduated from high school at Waubonsie Valley. There he was instrumental in getting the school to adopt volleyball as a varsity sport. At the University of Illinois, Tolis excelled on the men's Club Volleyball team.

Tolis' Cyclones volleyball club plays out of Vaughan Center and attracts athletes not only from Aurora, but Kaneland, Batavia and Oswego.

Tolis recently married Christina at St. Athanasios church here in Aurora. She is able to refocus his attention from volleyball with her excellent pasta shells stuffed with ricotta. We hope this Plainfield couple continues to contribute to West Aurora's performance
