A Hoosier native, April was a four-year gymnast and senior year track team member in high school. For college, she attended Ball State and Indiana Purdue Fort Wayne before completing her undergraduate education at Purdue. She was an Athletic Training / Health Education major with a Biology minor. She and her husband moved to the western suburbs where April's first (and only) job was at West Aurora.

April helped start the Health Career Academy in 1994. This curriculum attracts students heading for a career in all the health practices. Future doctors, nurses, paramedics and physical therapists enroll in this academy. The sophomores, juniors and seniors learn terminology, nutrition, anatomy and infection control. April teaches five classes a day.

After the academic school day concludes, April heads to the gym and field houses. There she rotates among all the teams that are practicing, ready to address and dress injuries. In the fall and winter, April appears at all home games, ready to deal with owies and injuries for both Blackhawks and our distinguished guests. During football season, because of the roster size, she serves at all the away games as well.

April and husband Paul, a free-lance writer, reside in Lisle. Their two sons, Steven and Drew, both athletes, keep their free time occupied. When April does find a few moments, she enjoys quilting. You can find her at the grill too, perfecting her barbequed ribs. For music, she'll find the country station. For movies, nothing beats the oldies like *Wizard of Oz* and *Gone with the Wind*.

April's maiden name is Rademacher. For those non-German scholars, this means maker of wheels. April's married name is Sonnefeldt. 2015-2016 Boys Basketball Wrap-Up



The boys' basketball program would like to thank the Boosters, West Aurora student body, administration, faculty, staff, cheerleaders, poms, step team, the coaches and sponsors of all of these programs, and the community for its support throughout the basketball season. Your involvement in our program and contests is a major ingredient to what makes West Aurora a great place. Our players and coaches could not be more appreciative.

Each level had different successes throughout the season. Our freshmen A team finished the season with an overall record of 14-10 and went 7-3 in the conference. The B team had an overall record of 8-11. This season for the freshmen as a whole was one of the better seasons in the past number of years.

Our sophomore team finished with an excellent overall record of 17-10, and they were 7-3 in the conference. The B team also did well finishing the season with a 6-2 record.

The varsity team showed development throughout the entire season. I received an encouraging letter during the early part of the year that stated: "through life there will be bumps in the road." That letter was symbolic of our season. The great aspect about this group of varsity players is that they never gave up and were committed to improving which we did as a team throughout the course of the season.

Our schedule was littered with outstanding competition. We faced seven teams on our schedule that were rated in the Top 25 for the Chicagoland area or in the states AP top 10. Five of those opponents competed in a sectional final and two of them are currently competing for a chance to go downstate. Our players never backed down and put forth their best effort against all of the teams on our schedule.

The highlights of the season on the court are two wins against East Aurora, the Senior Night victory against Glenbard East, and victories against Bartlett and South Elgin at home. I was also very proud of how we competed against Benet at the Batavia Night of Hoops.

The varsity finished the season with an overall record of 8-18. We finished 4th in the Upstate Eight Conference – Valley Division with a 5-5 record. Camron Donatlan was selected to the Rock Island Turkey Tournament All-Tournament team. Additionally, he was a unanimous selection to the UEC – Valley Division All-Conference team and was named to the All-Area teams for the *Daily Herald* and *Beacon*.

Caleb Siler was named to the UEC-Valley Division All-Conference Honorable Mention team. He was also named to the All-Area Honorable Mention team for the *Daily Herald* and *Beacon*.

Most importantly, the biggest highlight of our season came when the sophomores and varsity teams volunteered at the Special Olympics' basketball event. During that day, our players interacted with the athletes, officiated games, announced the names of the players on the championship teams, handed out medals, reported scores, and ran the scorer's table. The players carried themselves in a manner that should make the school and community proud.

One last thank you goes to our three seniors, Jordan Pitts, Sam Kolb, and Jalen Clark. They showed up to practices and games with a selfless attitude and a quiet leadership that the coaches and players respected immensely. They will be missed, but never forgotten. We wish them the best of luck with their future endeavors. Jordan, Sam and Jalen will always have a home with the West Aurora basketball program.

The Blackhawk wrestling team wrapped up our season with an 11-10 dual meet record. Our young men fought hard all year, and in January clinched the Upstate Eight Valley Conference Title. The team took 3rd place in the Upstate Eight Conference tournament with three individual champions. Erik Olson (145 lbs), Alex Gonzalez (160 lbs), and Devin Moore (285 lbs) all came away as champions.

Runners up at the conference tournament included Alex Roldan (132 lbs) and Josh Mayhew (195 lbs). Xavier Bijarro (113 lbs), and Joe Griffin (170 lbs) took 3rd place, and Cory Bunnetto (138 lbs) took 4th place respectively. Top three place winners at the conference tournament earned All Conference status.

Johnny Acevedo (132) also earned All Conference honors by defeating the conference champion two times in one day at the regional tournament along with qualifying for the sectional tournament. Steven Norman (182 lbs) also qualified for the sectional tournament by placing third at regionals. Steven had a strong performance at sectionals and was one match away from qualifying for the state tournament.

This year's Most Outstanding Wrestler was Isaac Jacquez who not only showed leadership with his on mat performance, but also in the practice room with his infectious work habits. At home, Kevin is coached by wife Nikki. J Nikki is a Carthage graduate and teaches second grade at Schneider Elementary. The couple lives in North Aurora.

Kevin's favorite pastime is fishing. He's a Muskie man, angling from his cabin in Minoqua, Wisconsin. Kevin likes it for the thrill of the hunt, always releasing the Pisces after capture. Kevin and Nikki have a fish and ski boat which supports their water ski and tubing activities as well.


